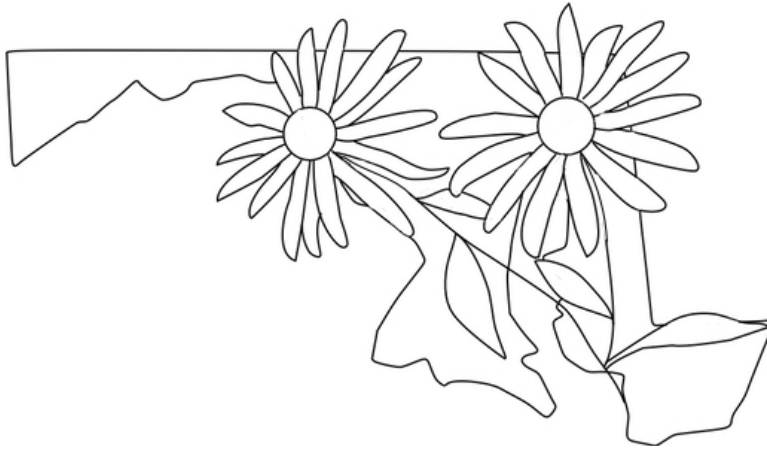


Maryland Flower Embroidery Pattern {Black-eyed Susan}

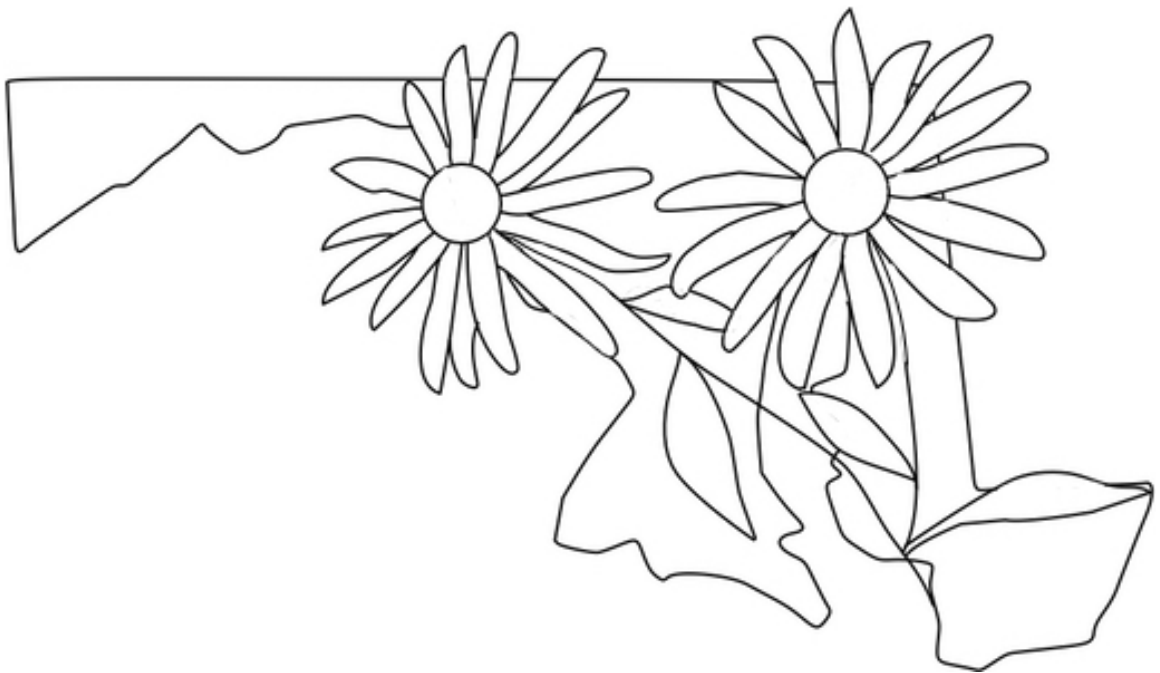


Full Size Design

Fits 5 or 6-Inch Hoop

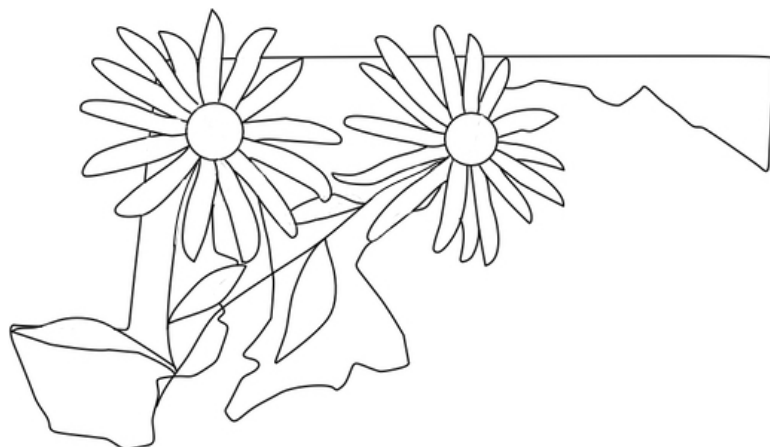


Fits 7 or 8-Inch Hoop

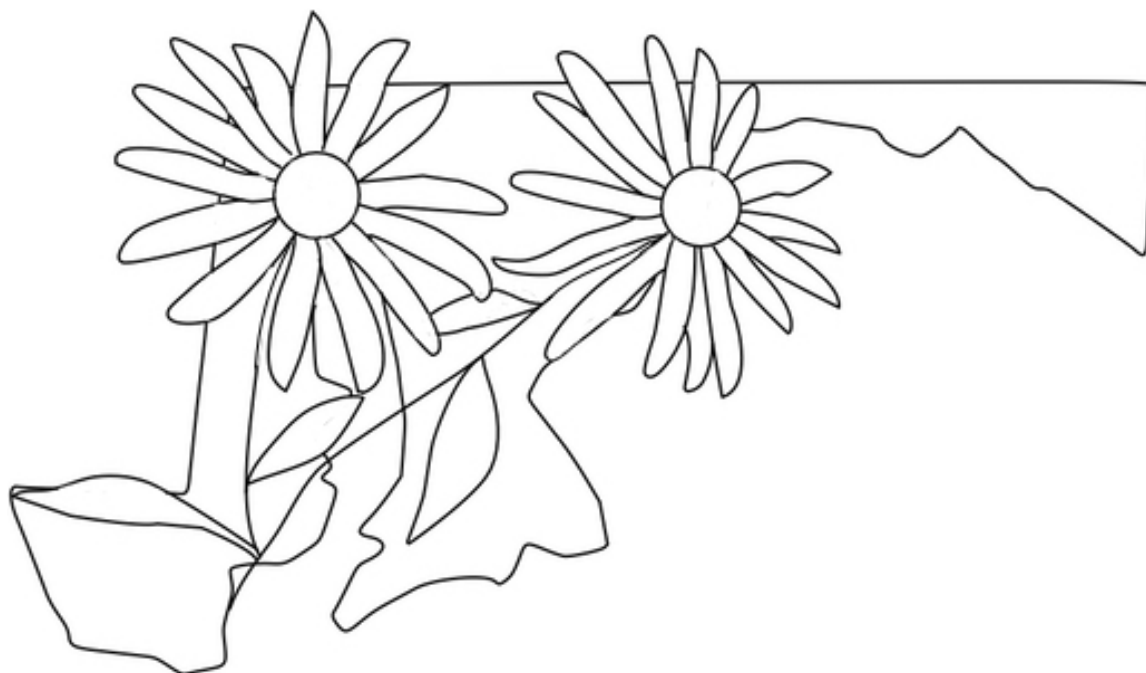


Reverse Image for Iron-On Transfer

State Outline:

Color - DMC 921

Stitch - Back, 4 strands

Flower Petals:

Color - DMC 743

Stitch - Split, 2 strands

Flower Centers:

Color - DMC 3371

Stitch - French Knot, 2 strands

Stems & Leaves:

Color - DMC 904

Stitch - Stem, 3 strands



Pattern Transfer

Light Table/ Window:

Place the pattern on a light table or tape it to a bright window. Position the fabric on top and secure in place. Trace the pattern onto the fabric using a water or air soluble transfer pen.

Dressmaker's Transfer Paper:

Transfer Paper can be found at many fabric stores. It comes in both light and dark colors. To use, secure your fabric to a flat, hard surface, cover with a piece of transfer paper and place the printed pattern on top. Trace the pattern using a pencil, fine tipped pen, or stylus. Press very firmly and make sure the paper does not move.

This is the best method for transferring patterns to a dark fabric. A white or yellow transfer paper will show up nicely on dark fabric.

Iron On Transfer Pencil or Pen:

Iron on transfer pens and pencils can be found at most fabric/sewing stores. First, print the REVERSE IMAGE pattern. Trace the pattern with the iron on pencil or pen. Place the traced pattern on an iron-safe surface and secure the fabric on top. Press a hot iron on the fabric for 5-10 seconds. Do not move the iron around. Gently lift an edge of the fabric to check that the design has transferred before removing the fabric.

* This method will leave permanent marks that need to be covered with embroidery or they will show on the finished piece.

Materials List

- Fabric Square in appropriate size for your pattern & hoop size choice:
Choose a fabric with a loose to medium weave such as a cotton, muslin, or flour sack. The above example uses a white muslin, but don't be afraid to try a darker color.
- Embroidery Hoop:
Size 5,6,7, or 8
- Embroidery Needle:
Size 7 or 9
- Water Soluble Pen or other items for pattern transfer.
(See Transfer Instructions)
- Small Scissors
- DMC Embroidery Floss:
921, 743, 904, 3371

The floss colors are for guidance. Feel free to substitute or change the colors. Have fun and make the pattern your own!
