WANDERING THREADS EMBROIDERY

Advent Calendar Embroidery Pattern



Materials List

• Fabric:

Size - 1 square approximately 14" x 14" in size.

If framing in a wooden frame use a fabric square approximately 3" larger than the frame on all sides to ensure you have enough extra fabric for folding and hemming.

Weight - A medium weave fabric such as a cotton, muslin, flour sack, or a linen blend is the easiest for stitching. However, a slightly thicker fabric can be a great choice if you are planning to frame your embroidery.

Color - Light or dark fabric are both suitable for this pattern. If using the suggested thread colors, keep in mind that they were chosen for a light colored fabric and you may need to make changes when using a darker fabric.

Embroidery Hoop:

Size 12-inch

• Embroidery Needle:

Size 7 or 9

 Water Soluble Pen or other items for pattern transfer: (See the Pattern Transfer Instructions)

- Small Scissors
- 3790, 725, 937, 347, 520, 3787, 648

 *These are the suggested colors shown in the stitched example. Please feel free to choose your own colors!
- Felt or Wooden Frame for finishing the embroidery: (See How to Finish Embroidery)

Embroidery Pattern Transfer Instructions

Light Table/ Window:

Place the pattern on a light table or tape it to a bright window. Position the fabric on top and secure in place. Trace the pattern onto the fabric using a water erasable transfer pen. The markings from this pen will remain until washed gently with water.

*Pro tip: A computer or tablet screen makes a great light box! Simply open this PDF on your computer, tape the fabric over the pattern on the screen, and trace it. No printer needed!

Iron On Transfer Pencil or Pen:

Iron on transfer pens and pencils can be found at many fabric/craft stores. First, print the REVERSE IMAGE pattern. Trace the pattern with the iron on pencil or pen. Place the traced pattern on an iron-safe surface and secure the fabric on top. Press a hot iron on the fabric for 5-10 seconds. Do not move the iron around. Gently lift an edge of the fabric to check that the design has transferred before removing the fabric.

*This method will leave permanent marks that need to be covered with stitches.

Transfer Paper:

Transfer Paper can be found at many fabric or craft stores. It is coated on one side with a powdery ink that will wash out of the fabric.

Transfer Paper (continued)...

To use, secure your fabric to a flat, hard surface, cover with a piece of transfer paper (powder side down) and place the printed pattern on top. Trace the pattern using a pencil, or stylus. Press very firmly and make sure the paper does not move.

This method works well for transferring patterns to dark fabric. A white or yellow transfer paper shows up nicely.

Stick & Stitch Transfer Paper

This dissolvable, sticky-backed, transfer paper can be drawn on by hand, or printed on using a printer. The pattern goes on the rough (non-sticky) side of the paper. If tracing by hand, use a light-colored pen or pencil and don't press too hard. If using a printer, make sure the setting is for plain, not photo, paper.

Once the pattern is on the paper, lay the fabric flat on a hard surface, remove the backing from the transfer paper, place the pattern on top, and press firmly. Stitch as usual.

When finished stitching, place the fabric in a shallow bowl of lukewarm water. Make sure the water completely covers the fabric. Leave it for 5-10 minutes. Shake the fabric in the water to remove any loose bits of semi-dissolved paper. Rinse and lay flat to dry.

How to Finish Embroidery: Two Methods

Frame in the Hoop


- 1. Using the inner ring of an embroidery hoop, trace a circle on a piece of felt and cut it out.
- 2. Place the finished embroidery in the hoop, stretch it smooth and tighten the screw. Trim the excess fabric around the edges roughly an inch wider than the hoop.
- 3. Cut off a long piece of sewing thread. Make sure it's long enough to stitch all the way around the circle. Leaving a 4-5-inch tail at the beginning, stitch around the edge with Running Stitch.
- 4. When you've stitched all the way around, grasp both ends of the thread and pull until the fabric gathers together. Tie a knot and cut off the excess thread.
- 5. Position the felt circle over the back and sew it into place with a whip stitch.
- 6. Continue sewing all the way around and tie off the thread.


In a Wooden Frame

- 1. Cut a piece of foam board to fit the inside dimensions of your frame.
- 2. Position the foam board in the center of your embroidery piece. Make sure it's straight! Flip over so the fabric is on the bottom. Starting with the long sides, fold the extra fabric into the center. If necessary, trim the fabric to leave a roughly 1-4" space in between. Pull the fabric tight and secure with long pins.
- 3. Repeat this process on the short sides. If the corners are bunching, fold them on a diagonal and trim a bit. The finished fabricwrapped foam board needs to fit snuggly inside the frame so try your best to avoid bulky corners.
- 4. Secure the fabric using a simple lacing technique. Fold the extra fabric from the short sides out of the way. Insert a needle with a long strand of thread about a 1/4-inch from the edge of the fabric and weave back and forth while pulling the fabric tight. Tie off the thread at the end and start a new piece. Finish the lacing by folding the fabric from the short sides into the middle and lacing it together.
- 5. Remove the pins and place the embroidery board inside the frame.
- 6. Replace the frame backing, flip it over, and admire your handiwork!




Full Size Design (Bottom of Pattern)





Color & Stitch Guide




Day 1:
Color - DMC 937, 347 & 3790
Stitch - Stem & French Knot,
3 strands
*Stitch the drum with 937 & 347/
Stitch the drum sticks with 3790
& use french knots for the bottom






Day 2: Color - DMC 347 & 648 Stitch - Rope & Back, 4 & 3 strands *Stitch the cane with 4 strands of 347. Add stripes with 3 strands of 648 using back stitch






Day 3: Color - DMC 347 Stitch - Back, 3 strands






Day 4: Color - DMC 3790 & 347 Stitch - Coral, 2 strands *Make the eyes with with small back stitches using 3790





Day 5: Color - DMC 725 Stitch - Star, 3 strands





Day 6: Color - DMC 937 & 648 Stitch - Back, 3 strands *Use 937 for the hat & 648 for the cuff & pom






Day 7: Color - DMC 725 & 347 Stitch - Split, 3 strands *Stitch the box & diagonal stripes w/ 725 - Stitch the ribbon w/ 347






Day 8: Color - DMC 937 & 347 Stitch - Back & French Knot, 3 strands *Stitch the holly with 937 & berries with 347 using French Knots






Day 9: Color - DMC 347 & 648 Stitch - Satin & Back, 3 strands *Fill in each candy stripe w/ satin stitch Use back stitch for the wrapper






Day 10:
Color - DMC 3790, 937, 347, 648
Stitch - Stem, Back, & French Knot,
3 strands
*Stitch the light strand with 3790
using stem & small back stitches.
Use French Knots to stitch the lights
in alternating colors.






Day 11: Color - DMC 937 & 347 Stitch - Scroll & French Knot, 3 strands * Use 937 for the wreath & 347 for the berries






Day 12: Color - DMC 3790 & 937 Stitch - Stem & Back, 2 strands *Use outline stitch for the gingerbread & back stitch for the details





Day 13: Color - DMC 347 & 648 Stitch - Chain & Back 3 strands *Use Chain for the mitten & back for the details






Day 14: Color - DMC 725 Stitch - Back, 3 & 2 strands *Use 3 strands for the bell outline & 2 strands for the inner details






Day 15: Color - DMC 937 & 648 Stitch - Whipped Stem, 3 strands *Stitch with 648 & whip (w/o going through the fabric) with 937





Day 16:
Color - DMC 347 & 648
Stitch - Cable, 3 strands
* Alternate the colors on the mug.
Use 347 for the handle & 648 for the steam






Day 17:
Color - DMC 347, 725, 3790
Stitch - Chain & Back, 3 strands
* Stitch the sleigh with chain using 347 & 3790. Stitch the present & bow w/ back stitch





Day 18:
Color - DMC 648 & 937
Stitch - Stem, Back, Stain, French
Knot, 3 strands
* Stitch the globe w/ stem in 638 &
the base w/ satin in 937. Stitch the
tree with back stitch & the snow w/
french knots





Day 19: Color - DMC 347 & 648 Stitch - French Knot, 3 strands wrapped x2




Day 20:

Color - DMC 648, 3790, 347 Stitch - Stem, Back & French Knot, 3 & 2 strands




* Stitch w/ 3 strands of 648 using stem - 2 strands of 3790 for the arms, hat & eyes using back- 2 strands of 347 for the nose using back - 2 strands of 3790 using french knots for the buttons






Day 21: Color - DMC 648 Stitch - Back 3 strands






Day 22:
Color - DMC 347 & 937
Stitch - Fishbone & French Knot,
2 strands
* Stitch the petals with fishbone
using 347 - fill the center with french
knots using 937






Day 23: Color - DMC 937 & 347 Stitch - Back & French Knot, 3 strands *Stitch the branch w/ back using 937 & the berries w/ french knots using 347





Day 24:
Color - DMC 725 & 347
Stitch - Split & French Knot, 2 strands
*Stitch the popper w/ 725 using split
& the candy with french knots





Day 25: Tree: Color - DMC 520 Stitch - Stem, 3 strands





Lights: Color - 725 Stitch - French Knot, 2 strands
